Program Content

This two-week program consists of three major components: Landscape Architecture Workshop, English Language Studies and Cultural Studies with Leadership development.



Component 2: American Cultural Studies and English Language studies

The course will cover cultural studies on American history, American government and American Society. It is also designed to help students improve their academic English language skills, including academic writing and oral presentation.

Component 1: Landscape Architecture Workshop:

Work on 2-3 design projects integrating all landscape concepts. Teamwork will be involved.

- To introduce the basic concept of landscape architecture design.
- To be able to understand form and composition, spatial sequencing and digital graphics.
- To be able to understand the western approach in scale, line weight, line quality and orthographic projection.
- To get hands-on field experience on paver construction.
- To be able to draw tree symbols and loose sketching and be creative in design process.
- To introduce the steps of design from concept, form to schematic design.
- To introduce 3D visualization through model construction of 3D spaces and Zen garden.
- To experience outdoor landscape, demonstration gardens and storm water mitigation in an outdoor setting.

Component 3: Leadership Development

Enrichment activities and formal lectures to facilitate students develop skills, knowledge and abilities to proactively take the initiatives to make productive, beneficial choices about their lives as well as contribute to society. The program will be designed to prepare students to be leaders in engineering from a cultural and social perspective.



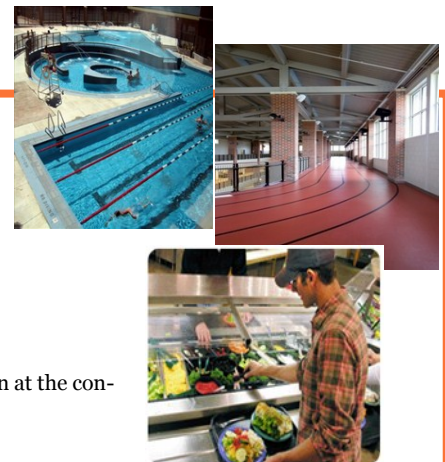
Accommodation and Certification
